SOLOMON ISLANDS UPDATE

Mahu Night Rally

Mahu Outreach Church is 35 minutes drive from Gateway Centre Church. On 17th September our youth went to Mahu for a night rally program. Families from nearby communities also attended the program.

We had an awesome night filled with God's presence as we gathered together proclaiming God's Word through preaching and singing. One of our young trainee pastors Francis Amasia preached on *Making the Right Choice*. Four young men accepted Jesus as Lord and Saviour into their lives. A woman who has been influenced and tormented by an evil spirit was delivered and gave her heart to Jesus.

Through the great power of the Holy Spirit, lives were healed, delivered and restored as people surrendered their lives to Christ. Praise His name for the great things He has done.

Embracing the Broken

Roslyn comes from South Malaita. She is a mother who has been through a lot of pain and was broken with no hope. One glorious day she met my wife Ruth and began to share her problems and what she was going through. Tears of hopelessness filled her eyes as she was telling her story.

Her husband had an affair with another woman and left her struggling with her

children. Her husband is not accepted back into the community by Roslyn's relatives. She had no one to turn to.

When she finished telling her story, Ruth began to share about God's great love and how He shows that love through his son Jesus Christ. Ruth told her that Jesus is the only answer to our problems. Roslyn burst into tears and wanted to experience God's love. Praise God! Roslyn gave her heart to Jesus and has finally found hope in God.

When Ruth prayed for her she felt God's peace and the burden of what she was going through removed from her heart. That day Roslyn gave her heart to Jesus and found new strength to move on in life knowing that God is with her despite all of the challenges she has faced.

Honiara City Council Outreach

On Saturday 18th September our young people were so excited to share God's love through singing and drama. We performed two dramas. Many were in tears as the young people performed and shared their testimonies.

Before the program started our youth had the opportunity to witness and share gospel tracks with people on the street. It was a new experience for some of our youth. 12 people gave their hearts to Jesus and accepted the free gift of eternal life.

One of the new converts is now attending our church here at Gateway Centre. His name is Jeremiah. Please pray for God's guidance and strength for Jeremiah as he starts his new journey with God.

Reaching Out to Children

Ministering to children is one of the most powerful ministries. Most of our CRC churches in the Solomon Islands start with children. Our church in Vella, Western Province started with eight children and has now grown to 60 people.

We have a weekly program on Thursdays at 3:00pm with children living in Foxwood Plains in Honiara. We believe that these children will one day turn into a great army of God. 45 children have given their hearts to the Lord. Now they are also bringing their parents. Pray that the parents will give their hearts to Christ.

Visiting East Malaita

In November I visited some of our CRC churches in the eastern part of Malaita Province. On Wednesday 17th November we held a combined service in Sasau CRC church. Members from multiple churches came together for a powerful prayer and fellowship service.

Thank God that some of the church members who had left their faith have recommitted their lives to Jesus. On Friday 19th November we travelled two hours from Sasau to Ata'a and stayed for the weekend.

We held a night rally service on Friday night and on Saturday we held an open-air outreach at Ata'a market. Our final service was held on Sunday morning. After the service we travelled back to Sasau and held another combined service on Sunday evening. I returned back to Honiara on 22nd November.

Youth Closing and Baptism

Our youth closing was held at Foxwood Plains on Friday 12th November. Two questions were discussed during our youth closing:

- 1. What is the greatest challenge you faced this year?
- 2. What is the most exciting experience you had this year?

Sitting down and listening to what our youth shared that night was awesome. Some were in tears when they shared the challenges they have been through and how God helped them to get through them. A great time indeed!

On Saturday 13th November we baptised six young people who have accepted lesus as Lord and Savior.

Helping Hands

On Monday 29th November our CRC youth, along with youth from other churches, willingly gave their time to clean up the mess in Chinatown after the looting and riots that took place from Wednesday to Friday the previous week.

It was really sad to see that shops in the Chinatown area had been burnt to the ground. Three lives were also lost during the burning and looting. Regardless of the chaos, our youth were willing to render their time to make a huge clean up.

Despite what happened at the end of November, God's hand is still over the Solomon Islands. We are believing and praying that everything will be back to normal soon.

CYCLONE RELIEF IN VANUATU

On Sunday 7th November, Pr Remy Adams and a small team flew from Port Vila to Santo Island to carry out construction on the roof of the staff house at World Missions Faith Training School (WMFTS) Vanuatu. It was built to a Category 5 cyclone rating and was completed on Thursday 11th November.

Cyclone Harold tore through the Solomon Islands, Fiji, Tonga and Vanuatu in April 2020. It left a path of destruction, taking 31 lives (two in Vanautu) and leaving 22 people missing.

WMFTS was badly damaged with two dwellings destroyed and one building half destroyed.

This visit was the third trip from Pr Remy and his team to rebuild and repair. The team was assisted by those living in and around the WMFTS property, including Pr John Weimani, school principal, and his wife Unuba, who are missionaries from Papua New Guinea (PNG).

The student dining and meeting room was reconstructed, roofs were repaired, and one student dorm was salvaged, with half the building now standing and able to be occupied.

The latest work on the staff house roof is very welcome, but there is more work to do in 2022 to complete the staff house and other buildings.

Further work that needs to be completed includes:

- Building a bush kitchen for students
- Constructing a fence around the school compound
- Repairing some of the beds
- Building a fly screen around the dining hall
- Installing a bush toilet for male students
- Repairing a ceiling affected by insects

Please continue to pray for a new cohort of students who are set to commence in April 2022. These students will complete the 12-month WMFTS training course.

Please also pray for Unuba who recently fractured her leg. Sadly, she also received the very sad news that her brother passed away and a memorial was held in Matuana village nearby on Wednesday 24th November.

The news about the passing of her brother came after one of her other relatives had also passed away due to COVID-19 in her home village in PNG.

Pr John and Unuba have been serving for a number of years now in Vanuatu. Please continue to pray for them, as well as for Pr Willy, Pr Remy and all the saints in our CRC churches and associated ministries in Vanuatu.

A big thank you to Adelaide Christian Centre, New Life Christian Centre, and our Goolwa and Albury CRC churches, for their financial contributions towards the repairs and rebuilding work at WMFTS.

Major objective of this project:

To have a fully functioning educational facility that will empower men, women and children through the provision of early childhood education and vocational training.

Goal One

Construct an educational facility that will be used for a preschool and vocational training. The outcome of this goal is to have a fully functioning educational facility that is equipped with furniture and resources needed to run a preschool and vocational training.

Goal Two

Empower men and women through the provision of vocational training courses

The outcome of this goal is that men and women are provided with an opportunity to gain valuable training that will increase their employability and improve their livelihoods.

Goal Three

Empower children through the provision of early childhood education.

The outcome of this goal is that by accessing quality preschool education, children are better prepared for primary school and are more likely to reach higher educational outcomes.

The long awaited vision is becoming a reality. The prophet Habakkuk states "the vision is for an appointed time, though it is slow in coming, wait for it because it will surely come to pass."

For years we have taught under poor conditions and have faced constant threats of flooding. Soon we will have an excellent environment for the teaching and training of students, as well as proper facilities for Zoom lectures and visual presentations.

This facility will include offices for our course principals, and a preschool that will be open to the community and will

provide our preschool teachers with practical experience.

FROM PR AI WARI

Training is one of the four pillars of the vision of Bethel Christian Centre and on a wider scale, of the CRC in PNG.

Training at Bethel has played, and continues to play, a vital role in the expansion of the work in PNG and the nations that Bethel is involved in around the world.

With the inception of the work at Bethel in the early 1970s up to now, training at Bethel has seen the development and growth of national and international workers who have come through its training programs.

Bethel has trained pastors, leaders, workers long and short term missionaries, missions supporters and senders, as well as missions promoters. People have come from all over PNG, nations outside PNG, a range of different Christian denominations, the secular field and private sectors within PNG.

The training facilities at Bethel have deteriorated over the years. This new facility that is currently being built - a double storey building with six classrooms - will enhance the training program and the expansion of the work in PNG and beyond.

Bethel Pastoral Oversight and the team are very thankful to the Lord to be able to see this project being fulfilled. We pray that this project will continue to help fulfil the vision of the CRC movement in the years to come.

BIBLE COLLEGE GRADUATION IN MAURITIUS

Finally after one and a half years due to COVID-19 restrictions, ten students of the Power of God Ministries Mauritius, completed their first year of study with CRC International Missions Bible College.

We had our first CRC 742 International Certificate in Christian Ministry and Theology Graduation Ceremony on Sunday 31st October 2021. Seven graduates received their Certificates, while three could not attend the ceremony due to health issues.

We were very blessed and challenged by Pr Phil Cayzer who was the guest speaker on that auspicious occasion. He shared on the vision and mission of CRC Missions Bible College. He quoted Matthew 24:14, 42-46. Now that they have graduated it is time to be faithful servants of God fulfilling their calling.

The most important thing is that each graduate must complete their mission, the work that the Lord has given them according to Acts 20:24.
